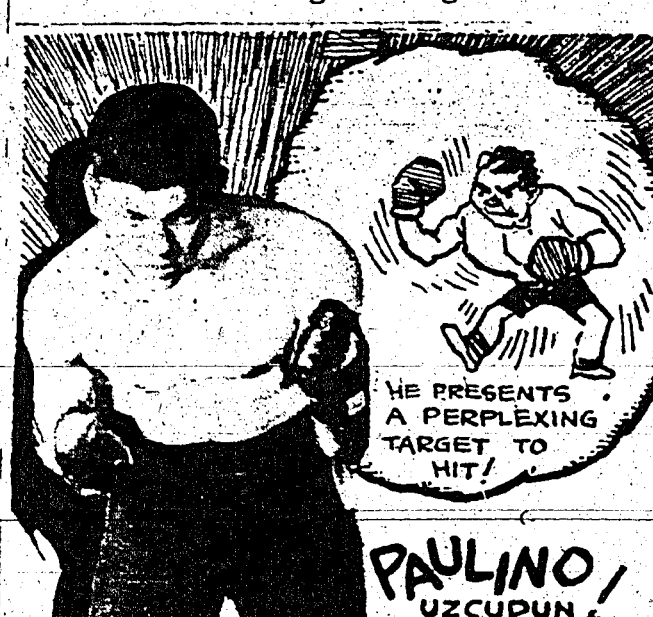

was found guilty by an Uphur County jury and given a sentence of 10 years. The new trial was granted on the grounds of additional evidence.

The appearance of Mr. and Mrs. Harris before an Uphur County grand jury, at which time they are said to have linked Davis with the whisky business, is held by the State to have been the motive for the slaying.

There was considerable debate on the admissibility of this testimony, the court sustaining it after lengthy argument by both sides.

The action was continued by a verbal tilt between William Caven of the State and Carol Florence of the defense counsel. Florence was grilling the witness, Mrs. Harris, when Mr. Caven interposed. After Mr. Caven had addressed the court, saying that some of the questions being asked were immaterial and had no bearing on the case, the Gilmer lawyer came back with a counter-attack. The court, however, made it known who was giving instructions. At various times the two would "get back" at each other, and the arbiter would rap for order.

Mrs. Harris was on the stand the entire morning and resumed her testimony this afternoon. She wore a black dress and had the strain of the morning's grilling was obvious. She told how she had worked in the field with her first husband.

WORLD-WIDE CO-OPERATION SAPIRO PLAN

Says He Always Has Advocated Control of Farm Products

DETROIT, Mich., April 1. (AP)—World wide co-operation of growers of staple products was the theme of a speech by Sapiro today in his \$100,000 libel suit against Henry Ford, who is charged to be a result of an automobile crash.

A clash with Senator James A. Reed of Missouri, chief Ford counsel, marked the first few minutes of co-operation. The Sapiro was attempting to learn from Sapiro the intricacies of co-operation. 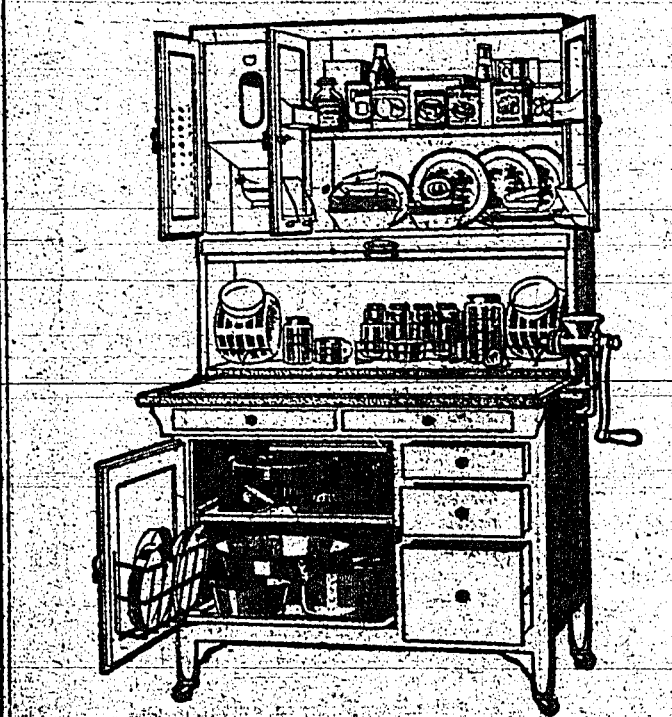
